The Sights of Toyohashi

There are plenty of other places to check out in Toyohashi as well. Go out and explore!

Recreation

4 Toyohashi Keirin Velodrome
The Toyohashi Bicycle Race Track features a lot area spanning 60,462 m², a 400 m cycling track, and spectator stands including a two-story stand that surrounds the track.

5 Toyohashi Zoo & Botanical Park (Nonhoi Park)
An all-in-one park with a 40-hectare zoo, botanical garden, museum of natural history, and amusement park on its grounds.

6 Re-spa Toyohashi
In addition to its pool and training room, Re-spa is outfitted with a bathhouse as well, making it an ideal location to relax after a day of cycling.

History

7 Futagawa Shuku Honjin Museum
A historical archive with exhibits centered on the three themes of "Tokaido", "Futagawa Shuku", and "Honjin".

9 Ushikawa Crossing
Since 1932 (Showa 7), ferries have been operated and managed by Toyohashi City to provide safe passage across the Toyo River.

11 Urigo Ruins
A Yayoi period village from approximately 2,000 years ago. Restored pit dwellings are available for viewing.

8 Merchant House "Komaya"
After the merchant house was covered to the public, this post station town became the only place in Japan to have "honjin", "sutagaya", and "shukue" lodgings available for viewing.

10 Folk Museum
The Toyohashi City Folk Museum uses the last standing wooden school building in the city to display around 1,000 historical objects collected from Toyohashi and the Higashi Mikawa Region.

Culture

12 Museum of Art & History
A museum in Toyohashi Park primarily focused on humanity and culture. Exhibits related to archeology, folk customs, history, and fine art are put up for display.

13 Public Hall
The Toyohashi City Public Hall was constructed in the Renaissance style in 1931 (Showa 6). In 1998 (Heisei 10), the building was registered as a Tangible Cultural Property of Japan.

Nature

14 "Kamo Shobuen" Garden
From late-May to mid-June, the flowers are illuminated at night during the Japanese Iris Festival.

15 Imo Bog
Water gushing from the Yumihari Flange formed this one-of-a-kind bog.

Tradition

16 Oni Matsuri
The Oni Matsuri is a traditional festival held every year on February 10th and 11th at the Akumikanbe Shinmei Shrine, and is one of Japan's intangible Cultural Properties.

Tezutsu Hanabi
The origin of tezutsu hanabi can be traced back to Yoshida Shrine. Launching these fireworks is a tradition with around 450 years of history and is practiced today in places across Japan.

Cuisine

Toyohashi Curry Udon
A local specialty of Toyohashi - Toyohashi curry udon. The two-layered dish is composed of a bed of rice with grated yam, topped by a layer of udon noodles.

Morning Breakfast
A "morning service" that is believed to have originated from Toyohashi's cafes (one of several theories).

Cherry Tomato
The East Mikawa Region is blessed with a temperate climate and mineral rich water, making it one of Japan's leading areas of agricultural production. The tomatoes, Cherry tomatoes, and Jiro persimmons harvested here are top-class, even in Japan.

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Toyohashi Chikuiwa
Dishes like "Toyohashi chikuiwa", "nameshi dengaku", "hama natto", and "Mikawa tsukudani" are a part of Toyohashi's 100+ year-old food culture.

Shrine & Temple

Akumikanbe Shinmei Shrine
Famous for the Oni Matsuri. ☎0532-52-5257

loji Temple
Sotoshu Furizan loji Temple is also called "Sazankadera Temple" because there are over 2,000 "sazankai", or camellia sasankua, planted on the temple grounds. Art "yoshuin" must be ordered and reserved in advance. ☎0532-21-1988

Kamo Shrine
Tokugawa Ieyasu is revered at Kamo Shrine. It is said that praying there will bring "certain victory" and "success in life". Famous for the "Japanese Iris Flower Festival". ☎0532-88-3359

Sekiganji Temple
In 726 AD (Jinki 3), Gyokuji, a priest of the Koyasan Shingon-shu Buddhist sect, is said to have founded Sekiganji Temple at the request of Emperor Shomu. You can enjoy hiking on Sekiganji Temple's "Nature Path". ☎0532-62-0012

Futagawa Fushimi Inari Shrine
In August of 1910 (Meiji 43), the first head of Futagawa Fushimi Inari Shrine, Shoyo Urano, received part of the spirit of Fushimi Inari Shrine's deity in Kyoto to enshrine at Futagawa Fushimi Inari Shrine. In spring, a variety of cherry blossoms called gyozokazakura can be seen in bloom. ☎0532-41-0057

Fumonji Temple
According to legend, in the fourth year of the Jinki era (727 AD), Fumonji Temple was founded by a Buddhist priest named Gyokuji. Many pieces of cultural property are kept in the temple. Fumonji temple is also fondly called "Momiji Temple" because it's a prime spot for viewing the autumn maple leaves.

Muro Hachimangu Shrine
Muro Hachimangu Shrine was founded in 697 AD (Monmu 1). The "Ee ja nai ka" movement that spread across Japan in 1937 (Keio 3) is said to have started at this shrine. ☎0532-31-1567

Yoshida Shrine
From long ago, Yoshida Shrine was revered by samurai households. Minamoto no Yoritomo is said to have sent his retainer twice to worship here on his behalf. Yoshida Shrine is beloved by the locals as a shrine that holds large tezutsu hanabi, or "Tezutsu Hanabi" festival. ☎0532-52-2553

Yoshida Castle "Gojyojin"
Among the many castles lords of Yoshida Castle throughout history, the family crest of the lord who constructed the castle's foundation, Ikeda Terumasa, is used. Character design done by the calligrapher Ai Suzuki. ☎0532-51-2430

The Pacific Cycling Road begins in Chiba Prefecture's Choshi City, and runs alongside the coastal areas of Kanagawa, Shizuoka, Aichi, Mie, and Wakayama Prefecture. The expressway ends in Wakayama City and its total length is about 1,400 km.
